MILAN

The new headquarters of the Fondazione are at Palazzo delle Stelline, made available by Milan's municipal authorities. This is where our staff and most of our internal researchers work. The Fondazione has conference and seminar rooms, and a library which will be open until late at night. The library, specialised in economics and the environment, has a collection of around 5,000 volumes and 200 journals. Also available will be an on-line catalogue on Internet and the most advanced technologies for bibliographical search.

VENICE

The headquarters of the Fondazione in Venice are at Palazzo Querini Stampalia, where the researchers involved in Local Agenda 21 are located, as well as part of the researchers participating in European research projects. There are archives on the Venetian lagoon and on the Mediterranean area. Seminars and congresses are also organised.





Fondazione Eni Enrico Mattei is a non-profit, non-partisan research institution established to carry out research in the field of sustainable development. Recognised by the President of the Italian Republic in July 1989, it has become a leading international research centre. Since 1990, the Fondazione has also hosted the secretariat of the European Association of Environmental and Resource Economists (EAERE).

From the Director

The activities of the Fondazione in the fields of research, diffusion of scientific knowledge and support to public policy have grown throughout 1996 and in the first months of 1997. The network of researchers based in the most prominent Italian and international universities and research centres has expanded, along with the number of scientific publications, workshops and congresses. A new journal, Equilibri, will be released in cooperation with the publisher il Mulino, starting from 1997.

Our support to public policy has been very rewarding. In particular, I wish to underline our role among the lead authors of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), the activities carried out with the European Commission, the OECD, the UN Commission for Sustainable Development, the Italian Ministries of the Treasury and of the Environment and with the municipal authorities of Milan and Venice for the formulation of their local Agenda 21.

Thanks to these activities, the Fondazione has succeeded in obtaining grants from the European Commission and other international institutions. External funding enables the Fondazione to grow in a framework of financial sustainability, thus guaranteeing the independence and credibility of its work.

In 1996 the Fondazione has moved to its new headquarters at Palazzo delle Stelline, which was put at our disposal by Milan's municipal authorities. These new offices are a unique endowment in the heart of Milan, and the Fondazione will have to strive to use these premises to the city's advantage, promoting culture and the diffusion of knowledge, starting from the new library. Together with the offices in Venice, Palazzo delle Stelline represents an essential ingredient of our activity. The organisation and heauty of these premises will allow us to attract the most qualified researchers and scholars who are the key of all research initiatives.





The Fondazione's activities are guided by four fundamental criteria: 1) to analyse relevant and innovative research areas; 2) to focus on "real" world issues; 3) to integrate multi-disciplinary approaches; 4) to create and foster international research networks.

The main areas of research are:

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

The analysis of sustainable development requires interdisciplinary expertise, including development, environmental and transport economics, population and migration dynamics, natural resource management policies and international negotiation processes. This programme integrates specific research on each of these issues and highlights the relations that affect the dynamics of sustainable development.

POLITICAL FCONOMY

Objectives, decision-making and results in the economic field are closely interrelated with the workings of political, legislative, and social institutions. This area of research consists of different projects that examine institutions and behaviours from a theoretical and empirical point of view.



THE FIRM AND THE ENVIRONMENT

Firms have a fundamental role in the resolution of environmental problems and in the promotion of sustainable development. This area of research develops tools for environmental accounting and reporting that can be used by firms and guide public policies.




